## Aims and Objectives

The Pannonia Research Awards are designed to encourage research and publishing activities in the competence areas offered by the programmes of study of the University of Applied Sciences Burgenland. With the creation of these awards, persons who have submitted excellent papers on the theme of these awards “Regional and European future issues in the key competence areas Business Studies, Information and Communication Technology and Management, Energy and Environmental Management and Health” should be supported and gain recognition for their endeavours.

## Eligibility Criteria

The Pannonia Research Awards are targeted at both experienced and junior researchers whose paper is either in the category of “Pannonia Research Awards for Junior Researchers” or “Pannonia Research Awards for Teachers and Researchers”.

Criteria for the work are that the research:

- is presented in German or English and that the formal aspects of academic writing conventions are adhered to,
- is not a resubmission in the framework of the Pannonia Research Awards,
- falls into one of the different key competence areas offered by the University of Applied Sciences Burgenland (Business Studies, Information and Communication Technology and Management, energy and Environmental Management, Health),
- “Pannonia Research Awards for Teachers and Researchers” should comprise approximately 10 pages and not be older than two years. Further, that the content and form should be at a level similar to other papers published in appropriate academic literature,
- “Pannonia Research Awards for Junior Researchers” should comprise approximately 6 pages and not be older than two years. Further, that the content and form should be at a level similar to other papers published in appropriate academic literature. Approved master theses and other individual works of graduates not older than two years can be submitted.

Award winning entries will be published. By signing the submission you affirm that no rights of third persons, especially copy rights, will be violated. Publishing rights will be assigned to the University of Applied Sciences. The jury’s decision is final. By signing the submission participants accept all conditions mentioned above.

The following additional information should accompany the application, which should be submitted in one copy, in addition to a CD-ROM:

- Name and address of the institution, including telephone number and e-mail address (when submitting in the category of “Pannonia Research Award for Teachers and Researchers”)
- Name and address of the researcher(s) (including telephone number and e-mail address)
- Under which category it is being submitted (“Pannonia Research Awards for Teachers and Researchers” or “Pannonia Research Awards for Junior Researchers”)

Selection of the applications received will be made by an academic jury using a double blind system. Originality, academic quality and applicability will be taken into consideration. (No legal recourse is allowed).

## Researcher Target Group

Entries for the Pannonia Research Awards will be welcomed from lecturers (full and part-time), researchers and junior researchers (graduates) from the University of Applied Sciences Burgenland and European universities or higher education institutions.

## Timescale

Entries for the 2010 awards should be addressed to: Fachhochschulstudiengänge Burgenland Ges.m.b.H., Campus 1, A-7000 Eisenstadt, Reference “Pannonia Research Award” and arrive no later than 25th July, 2010.

The notification of the prize-winners will take place in autumn 2010.
